Get to Know Your... Port Captain!

Get to Know Your... is a new mini-series designed to introduce the membership to each of their 2014 Members of the Board. Our first segment features our Port Captain, Jim Harper.



When did you begin sailing?

1985 – I was in College at the University of South Florida and I started recreational sailing around the bays and intracoastal waterways.

What was the first boat you sailed in and/or your best beginner sailing memory?

Except for some childhood rides, the first boat I drove was a Prindle 18 catamaran. A friend left it in my driveway when he moved away and I used to sail it out to some barrier islands in St. Petersburg, Florida and camp overnight. We would get several boats sailing over and camping and they are some great memories.

How long have you been a WSC member?

I have been a member since 2009. I had not sailed for about 12 years and was working with Tim Mills; I came out to crew for him a few times and realized how much I missed sailing. I bought a Thistle and started learning how to race dinghies.

What is your favorite thing to do in Portland during the non-sailing season?

Ride bikes, hang out with the family, and hike.

What does a Port Captain do, exactly?

Port Captain is in charge of the grounds and docks. His duties include planning activities and scheduling for volunteers, coordinating with the harbor master on the priorities of projects, and coordinating with the board on long-term planning and facility maintenance expenses.

Finally, what is the best sailing advice you've ever been given?

Learning to race in a competitive fleet you get plenty of advice, and it is all welcomed. I would say one of the better pieces of advice is one I wish I could follow more often: the three ways to get better are "Time on the Water, Time on the Water, and Time on the Water."

2014 Al Morris Memorial Regatta

NOTICE OF RACE

Rules

This regatta will be governed by ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016 and the prescriptions of US Sailing and the applicable one-design class associations, except as any of these are altered by the Sailing Instructions. The low point scoring system Appendix A will apply. Each boat's score will be the sum of all races.

Eligibility

This regatta is open to all one-design sailing dinghies and catamarans, such as Lido, Europe, Tasar, Laser, Vanguard 15, Coronado 15, Snipe, Thistle, Daysailer, Flying Scot, Lightning, 420, 470, 505, i550, and A-Cat.

Racing

We are planning on sailing as many races as possible. The minimum for a regatta will be three races. There will be no races started after 3pm Sunday.

Launching/Parking

Yale Park (Day-use area) will be the host site for all sailing activities, Saturday BBQ, awards and skippers meeting. The park has real restrooms, 4 lane launch with a small dock and overnight (mast-up) boat parking.

Lodging or Camping Options

We have reserved the Cougar Group (tents only) Campground at Yale Lake and will be launching from Yale Park which is two miles down the road. The group site check-in is 8/8 at 16:00 and the main access gate closes at 21:00 each night. The town of Cougar, WA has other Lodging, B&B, RV sites with hook up, store, gas station and restaurants. Cougar is a 5 minute drive to the Cougar Campground and Yale Park boat launch. First 10 group campground registrants will receive a parking weekend hang-tag pass.

About the Lake

Yale Lake is a 3,780 acre reservoir on the Lewis River at the South foot of Mt. Saint Helens. Two boat launches are located on the lake. The normal wind pattern runs southerly from the dam end at a steady 12-16 knots, making for ideal sailing conditions.

Yale Regatta at Beaver Bay

WSC Board of Director's Meeting

March 18, 2014

Call to order: 6:56 pm.

Attending: Ron Runyan, Mark Sandifer, Bart Brush, Toby Deming, Jim Harper, Joe Corvelli, Dave Jursik and guest Marilyn Hodson.

Minutes were previously approved and published in March issue of Telltales.

Club Manager Hiring Committee

Marilyn Hodson, chairing the committee to hire the new club manager, reported on the progress of the search. To date two candidates have been identified and a national search is underway to broaden the pool of candidates. Tim Mulvaney has generously offered to post the job on his company's Career Builder website, consolidate and make an initial assessment of the viable candidates and then forward them to the committee for review. In addition, George Yioulos is leveraging his industry contacts to identify candidates and the board agreed to reach out to their respective national fleet organizations to post advertisements in the appropriate forums and publications. The goal remains to have the new club manager in place prior to LauraLee's May 1 retirement so a smooth transition is achieved. However, it was also recognized that this is a very ambitious goal and the focus will remain on finding and attracting the best candidate to fill this critical job role for the Willamette Sailing Club.

Commodore's Report

A resolution was passed allowing Ron Runyan to sign the Department of State Lands lease for the river bottom adjacent to the south dock.

Vice Commodore's Report

Mark Sandifer, working with the committee on Junior Sailing, has developed a charter that governs the membership, officers and operations of this committee. The charter defines a leadership structure that includes the Vice Commodore and 2 voting members representing each junior program (Opti, Laser and High School). Meetings will be held in January, May, August and November with additional meetings as required. It was agreed that minutes of the meetings would be published in Telltales and that the charter would be reviewed and updated annually. Copies of the Junior Sailing Committee Charter are available in the WSC office for review.

An additional issue was raised about the appropriate fee structure for weekend Junior Sailing events held at WSC. While these began as WSC scrimmages, they have begun to attract sailors from other clubs in Oregon and taken on the form of more formal regattas. WSC incurs costs in hosting these events and Mark recommended that a simple fee structure be defined (e.g. x\$/participant) so that both the WSC programs and other clubs can budget for these expenses in their annual planning. A decision was made that the Treasurer will evaluate the actual costs of opening the club for these events and return to the board with a recommendation to be implemented with the Fall Junior Sailing season. Until that time, the board determined that no fees would be charged for the weekend high school events. This does not include other formal regattas, hosted by Willamette Sailing Club or other guest clubs using WSC facilities (i.e. Vancouver Lake Sailing Club), that are already

planned for 2014 that have an anticipated or published fee structure.

Lastly, there have been occasions where high school and adult regattas are scheduled on the same weekend. It was agreed that while it is possible to accommodate the conflicts that are already on the schedule this year, in the future, the Fleet Captain will work with the Office staff to define a process to both prioritize potential regattas and avoid future conflicts.

Rear Commodore's Report

Bart Brush reported on the progress of construction contracts for the new club house. The two aspects discussed were the separate contracts for upland work by Grand and Benedicts and the construction of the floats and building by Steelhead Construction. On the former, Jim Harper reported that there have been significant issues surrounding the ownership of Beaver Avenue which required resolution prior to the permitting for the placement of a new water line, under the railroad tracks, for fire suppression in the club house. Those issues have been resolved and the contract is being reviewed, and final pricing being prepared by Grand and Benedicts. This is a significant step forward in resolving one of the remaining permitting issues.

Bart reviewed the status of the contract negotiations with Steelhead Construction. A clause in the WSC contract requiring a performance bond, which provides insurance against the failure of Steelhead to complete the construction, would cause a significant financial commitment by Steelhead to acquire the bond, through a process that would delay the start of the project by an expected 6-8 weeks, and would cause WSC to incur significant incremental and unbudgeted costs. After a lengthy discussion, the board determined that through the leadership of the construction committee, the onsite project manager overseeing construction and confidence in Steelhead Construction's experience and ability to complete the project as defined in the contract, the board agreed to proceed with an amended contract that does not include the performance bond. This does introduce risk, but it avoids the unbudgeted expense and most importantly, the board has confidence, as demonstrated by the committee's extraordinary progress to date, that the right oversight is in place to achieve WSC's goals on this project.

Fleet Captain's Report

Race committee assignments for the full season are completed and will be posted on the web.

Port Captain's Report

The bocce ball court will be removed as a requirement of the permitting process for the new club house. A more significant issue is the relocation or sale of E dock to accommodate the upgrade and relocation of the boat house. E dock began its life in the World War II construction of Liberty boats, is very stout and likely the best dock at the club. If the dock is retained, it will require relocation during the boat house upgrade/move. Alternatives are being evaluated but a near term solution is required. Joe Corvelli will investigate the possibility of temporary moorage on Swan Island.

Office Report

The Learn to Sail registration is open with a great response to date. As of March 14, 60% of the River Adventure camp was full for the entire summer which is a testament to the strength of the program. WSC's camps



were featured with a full page article in the recent Oregonian weekend addition.

Planning for the 2014 Wooden Boat Festival is underway. Volunteer recruiting will commence within the next 30 days.

Jim VanHook, WSC's new harbor master, has built and installed a new kayak and stand up paddle board rack on G dock to store club owned equipment.

Treasurer's Report

WSC's bank balance as of February 28, 2014 was \$592,271 with YTD income of \$98,521. WSC's accountant has submitted a draft year-end tax statement (form 990) that is undergoing review.
